And Seville is home to a treasure trove of historic structures, including three UNESCO World Heritage sites. Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Barcelona today.

Barcelona → 2 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Barcelona

Included meals: welcome dinner

Welcome to Spain! Meet your Tour Director and fellow travelers at tonight's welcome dinner in Barcelona. This cosmopolitan, coastal city is the capital of Spain's Catalonia region and is celebrated for its spectacular art and architecture—particularly works by Pablo Picasso, Joan Miró, and Antoni Gaudí.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Barcelona

Included meals: breakfast

Discover why the Catalan capital is touted for its unparalleled architectural landmarks, many of which are UNESCO World Heritage sites.

- Step inside La Sagrada Família, Gaudí's famous masterwork-in-progress.
- Drive along Passeig de Gràcia and past Gaudí's Casa Batlló, or House of Bones, widely considered to be one of the architect's masterpieces.
- Stop at Montjuïc, where the 1992 Olympic Games took place, and soak in the panoramic views from Mirador de l'Alcalde park.
- Pass Plaça d'Espanya, where many of Barcelona's main roads intersect.

Enjoy a free afternoon in Barcelona or add an excursion.

Madrid → 3 nights

Day 4: Train ride to Madrid

Included meals: breakfast, dinner

Journey by high-speed train to Spain's capital, Madrid, a bustling city that's latticed with elegant boulevards and blanketed with vast, manicured parks. Then, sit down for an included dinner.

Please note: Porterage is not included for the train transfers. Travelers must be comfortable lifting and carrying all luggage over steps, onto platforms, and into luggage storage.

Day 5: Sightseeing tour of Madrid

Included meals: breakfast

Get acquainted with Spain's cosmopolitan capital city with the help of a local guide.

- View the Royal Palace, Spain's largest royal residence.
- Pass by the Temple of Debod, a reassembled temple from ancient Egypt.
- View the city's many squares, including Plaza Colón and Plaza Neptune.
- Explore the Prado, a world-class art museum that began as the private collection of the Spanish monarchy and is home to the works of Goya, Velásquez, and more iconic artists.

Enjoy a free evening in Madrid or add an excursion.

Day 6: Free day in Madrid

Included meals: breakfast

Seville → 2 nights

Day 7: Seville via Córdoba & olive oil farm

Included meals: breakfast, tasting

Ride a high-speed train to the Andalusian city of Córdoba, once an important Roman city and a major Islamic center in the Middle Ages. *Please note: Travelers should feel comfortable managing their own luggage while getting on and off the train.*

Then, discover Andalusia's history and cuisine.

- Explore Córdoba, which was once home to 700 mosques, 900 public baths, and 70 libraries.
- Pass by the city's Roman Bridge, which was built in the first century BCE and features 16 irregularly patterned arches.
- View the medieval Albolafia Mill, one of several historic watermills in the city.

- Enter the Mezquita, a UNESCO World Heritage site built in the eighth century as a mosque and then transformed into a cathedral during the Christian Reconquista of 1236.

After exploring Córdoba, settle in on your coach and continue on to a family-owned olive oil farm for a tour and tasting.

- Join a local guide for a tour of the farm's olive groves, mill, and cellar.
- Learn how olives are grown, harvested, and turned into olive oil, one of Spain's major exports.
- Sample some orange-infused olive oil drizzled on top of chocolate gelato.
- Enjoy free time to shop for made-on-the-farm products.

Continue on to Seville and spend a free evening in the city.

Day 8: Sightseeing tour of Seville

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner

Uncover the beauty of Seville—Andalusia's capital city, which is known for its historic churches, palaces, and Moorish buildings—on a guided sightseeing tour.

- View the tiled pavilion of the Plaza de España.
- Pass the whitewashed homes of Barrio de Santa Cruz.
- See the Gothic Seville Cathedral, the third-largest church in the world.
- Enter the Royal Alcázar, a palace that was once home to King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella.

Celebrate your trip with your group members at a farewell dinner.

Flight Home

Day 9: Departure

Included meals: breakfast (excluding early morning departures)

Transfer to the airport for your flight home or continue on to visit Granada and Costa del Sol.

+ Granada & Costa del Sol extension

Soak up sunshine—and stunning architecture—in southern Spain as you travel to Granada and Costa del Sol. Along the way, you'll explore the white village of Ronda and the staggeringly beautiful Alhambra alongside expert local guides. When you're not drinking in the region's storied history or stunning, Mediterranean landscape, you can grab a seat inside a tapas bar for a taste of modern life in Spain's sunny southern reaches.

Granada → 1 night

Day 9: Granada via Ronda

Included meals: breakfast

Head south toward Granada, stopping along the way to explore the famous cliffside town of Ronda with a local guide.

- Admire Ronda's picturesque white buildings and pass the Plaza de Toros bull ring, which was constructed in the late 1700s.
- View the staggering Puente Nuevo, the 18th-century bridge that spans El Tajo gorge and connects Ronda's old and new towns.
- Walk by Mondragón Palace and enter Casa don Bosco, a historic home with beautiful views over the surrounding countryside.
- Enjoy free time for lunch in the old town.

Then, continue on to Granada.

Costa del Sol → 2 nights

Day 10: Sightseeing tour of the Alhambra & transfer to Costa del Sol

Included meals: breakfast

Set off on a guided tour of the Alhambra, the Moorish sultans' last stronghold in Spain.

- Walk along the Cypress Promenade to view the upper and lower gardens of Generalife Palace, once the Nasrid dynasty's summer home.
- Enjoy panoramic views overlooking Granada and the surrounding countryside.
- View the unique curved, Roman-style courtyard inside the Palace of Charles V.
- Admire the blend of Western art and Islamic design as you stroll through ornamented courtyards.
- Enter the Nasrid Palaces and see the Mexuar, where the Council of Ministers once met.
- See where the royal family lived during visits to Comares Palace and the Palace of the Lions.

Then, head to Costa del Sol, a stretch of fashionable towns and beaches hugging the Mediterranean.

Day 11: Free day on Costa del Sol

Included meals: breakfast

Spend a free day on Costa del Sol or add an excursion.

This evening, enjoy a farewell drink as you celebrate your trip with your fellow group members.

Day 12: Departure

Included meals: breakfast (excluding early morning departures)

Transfer to the Málaga airport for your flight home.

Day 3: Park Güell & La Pedrera

\$109/\$119* (4 hours, departure time varies)

On today's excursion, discover the magnificent works of Antoni Gaudí, the famed Spanish architect known for his bold, distinct designs. Casa Milà is the first stop.

Take a guided tour of this building, popularly known as "La Pedrera," which was built by Gaudí between 1905 and 1910. Everything about the building is visually unique, from its wave-like stone structure to the grandly designed roof. Next, you'll head to Park Güell, also designed by Gaudí. Your guide will lead you through the park, which contains stunning buildings, intricate stonework, and colorful mosaics. At the top of the park, marvel at the brilliant views of Barcelona.

Day 5: Traditional Spanish Evening

\$119/\$129* (3 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

Start the evening with a stroll through Plaza Mayor. Your Tour Director will tell you about the history of the square, where you'll see locals and travelers alike. On your way to dinner, walk through the illuminated streets of Madrid, taking in the local neighborhood ambiance in the evening light. Then, enjoy conversation, camaraderie, and live music at one of the oldest restaurants in the city. Between traditional Castilian courses, you'll be entertained by tuno music, an artistic tradition with its roots in Spain's universities.

Day 6: Toledo

\$105/\$115* (8 hours, departure time varies)

Today, discover Toledo, the cliff-top city often referred to as La Ciudad Imperial ("The Imperial City"). Upon arrival, you'll have some free time to explore. Later in the afternoon, you'll kick off a guided tour at Toledo Cathedral: a massive Gothic structure housing a treasure trove of stained glass windows and golden artifacts. Gaze upon its sacristy, containing masterpieces by the likes of Van Dyck, El Greco, Rubens, and Titian. After exploring the labyrinth of medieval alleyways in the heart of the city, you'll visit the Church of Santo Tomé—a former mosque, dating to the 12th century, graced by one of El Greco's finest works, "The Burial of the Count of Orgaz." End your day with a stop at Santa María la Blanca, a museum that ranks as one of the oldest synagogues in Europe. Please note: This tour involves some walking over uneven terrain. Also, depending on the day of the week, the sites you visit may change.

Day 6: Madrid Flamenco Show

\$139/\$149* (5 hours, departs in the evening with light dinner)

Flamenco is a passionate, seductive art form exclusive to Spain, and you'll experience the clapping, singing, and stamping of this celebrated tradition during a live show in Madrid. This Andalusian style of dance combines guitar playing (toque), song (cante), and rhythmic handclaps (palmas). A light dinner of tapas will be served alongside local wine at a nearby restaurant

before the expressive, dramatic, colorful performance.

Extension excursion options

Day 11: A Day in Gibraltar

\$155/\$165* (8 hours, departs in the morning with lunch)

Make your way along the Costa del Sol to Gibraltar, a pocket of British culture in the Mediterranean. This overseas territory of Great Britain is most famously home to the iconic Rock of Gibraltar. Today, you'll get a close-up look during a visit to the Gibraltar Nature Reserve, established in 1993 to protect native wildlife. Here, get to know the resident population of semi-wild Barbary macaques while keeping an eye out for the many species of migratory birds that use the rock as a resting place. Then, take in sweeping views of the ocean (and Africa on a clear day) as you journey to sites such as St. Michael's Cave, Spur Battery, and Europa Point Lighthouse. End with an included lunch and pint at a local pub and some free time in town before transferring back to Costa del Sol. Please note: As Gibraltar is a territory of the United Kingdom, you must show your passport to enter. Make sure you have yours with you before this excursion departs.
